• Credentials and Experience: Check for detailed information about the dentist's qualifications, experience, and any specializations. Where did they receive their training? How long have they been providing these advanced services?

• Patient Resources: Many good dental websites offer educational resources, blogs, or articles about specific procedures they perform, which can be a sign of a dentist who is committed to patient education. This also shows the dentist's knowledge and expertise in those subjects.

## 4. Patient Reviews and Testimonials

Patient reviews provide reallife insights into a dentist's practice. Look for reviews on multiple platforms, such as Google, Yelp, and specialized dental review sites. Pay attention to both the quantity and quality of reviews. Consistent positive feedback is an excellent sign of a quality dental office.
