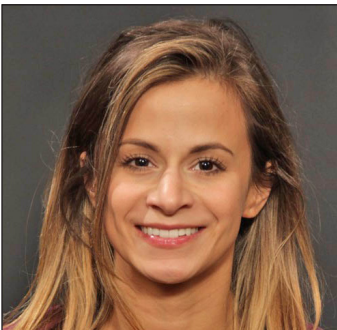
Limitations of no-prep veneers

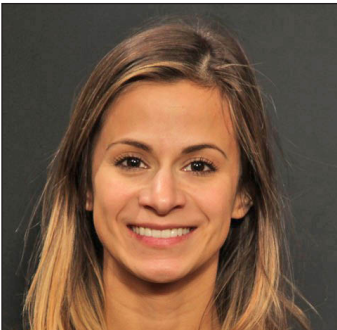
are a good candidate for no-prep veneers.

The American incarnation of Mother's Day was created by Anna Jarvis, who organized a worship service and celebration honoring mothers in 1908. Mother's Day became an official U.S. holiday in 1914. Jarvis later denounced the holiday's commercialization and tried to remove it from the calendar.

Celebrating mothers and motherhood dates back to ancient times. Mother goddesses and feminine deities associated with creativity, birth, fertility, nurturing, and growth, have been revered throughout human history and are found in mythologies throughout the world.

In Greek mythology, Gaia is the primordial goddess of the Earth and the personification of Earth itself. She is considered the ancestral mother of all life, from whom all beings were born.

Isis is a prominent

goddess in Egyptian mythology who symbolizes motherhood and fertility. She is considered the Egyptian goddess of childbirth, mothers and magic.

Cybele is an Anatolian mother goddess, often referred to as the Great Mother or Magna Mater. She was worshipped primarily in Phrygia and later in Greece and Rome, where she was associated with nature and fertility.

Asase Yaa is worshiped as the great female spirit of the Earth in the indigenous religion of the Akan people of West Africa.

In Hinduism, Saraswati, Lakshmi, Radha, Parvati, Durga and other goddesses represent both the feminine aspect and the shakti (power) of the supreme being known as the Brahman.

In the 19th century in the British Isles, "Mothering Sunday" was celebrated on the fourth Sunday in Lent. On this day, clerics and curates were encouraged to churches.



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
